PENSION BILL PASSES LEGISLATURE
MIKE TRIMBO HAS BEEN FOLLOWING THIS AND SAYS:

"Pioneer press this AM: (5-18-10)

A new law patches up public employee pension plans by requiring local governments and their workers to make larger contributions and holding down benefit increases. The bill is aimed at averting a pension crisis caused by states failure to fully fund its pension commitments. Another article:

Retirees sue state for pension change.

In the legislative session that ended Monday, state lawmakers curtailed the yearly rate of increase for pension benefits from a 2.5 percent annual to between 1 and 2 percent depending on the pension fund. Attorneys for the state employees say that violates the U.S. and Minnesota constitution.

Think we'll get 1 or 2 % instead of our customary 2.5% for the past couple of years.

Days of nice raises are over."

HOWARD COSTELLO WROTE: "Noticed in the Mpls paper (5-18) the pension bill that will

reduce our future benefits was passed by the legislature and was signed by Gov Pawlenty.

Already a lawsuit has been filed by retirees attempting to overturn it. If the law prevails it will cost all of us many thousand of dollars in increased benefits in the future." (stay tuned!)

He is, so far, the only football player to have played in the Rose Bowl, the Canadian Grey Cup, and the Super Royl

For 40 years he has been deeply missed by his wife, Judy, daughters Julie and Jill, his sister Marlene, and many friends and family.
