FALL INSTITUTE UPDATE




The conference is being held at the beautiful Grand View Lodge in Nisswa, MN October 23rd through October 25th, 2019 with over 400 attendees. A social hour and special awards ceremony event will take place the evening before on October 22nd. The Fall Institute Program Committee has done an outstanding job laying out a diverse program that covers a wide range of training opportunities. There are 3 keynote speakers and over 30 breakout sessions being offered this year. The program was completed with a new look thanks to the hard work of the program committee. Furthermore, a decision has been made to going green in 2020 and moving to the app next year at the Fall Institute for the full program. This is an exciting change for 2020! We welcome about 60 exhibitors to the resource fair this year! Many that went above and beyond with sponsorships. This year MCA continued to offer Continuing Education credits (15 hours) and Minnesota Board of Peace Officer Standards and Training (POST) credits (16 hours). 

LEGISLATIVE AFFAIRS UPDATE



I hope to see many of you at the fall institute. Legislators will be present on Wednesday, October 23rd, during the opening general session where Commissioner Paul Schnell will address us and then introduce Rep. Dan Wolgamott, DFL representative from the St. Cloud area. Commissioner Schnell will also introduce Vice Chair of the House Corrections Sub-Committee, who will make some comments at the conference. This will be followed by a break-out session sponsored by our Legislative Committee, where the agenda is wide open for all conference attendees to meet and greet Rep. Wolgamott. During the session we will discuss our 2020 legislative agenda and any concerns you might want to address. I sincerely hope that many of you will take this opportunity to find out what's in store for the 2020 session.

On October 3rd, there will be a mini-session of the House located in the Winona area, where the Judiciary Finance and Civil Law Committee and the Public Safety and Criminal Justice Reform Finance and Policy Committees will be meeting that morning with representatives of the 3rd Judicial District. The purpose is to discuss a number of items brought forward in the 2019 session with special emphasis on several juvenile justice proposals and re-entry programs. We will be paying attention to their meetings and report back to our membership of their actions.

As we present our legislative agenda to our membership at the fall institute, I will be providing the information to share with legislators prior to the start of the 2020 session. The 2020 session begins on February 11th.

I look forward to seeing you at the fall institute!

The West Central Regional Juvenile Center located in Moorhead, MN, is a co-ed facility offering secure and non-secure detention, secure residential programming, non-secure evaluations, and independent living skills programming (coming early 2020) services. The facility is currently undergoing an expansion/remodel that will provide for additional programming options, increased capacity, and increased level of services.

Programming at the WCRJC is based in cognitive-behavioral theory and has many optional components (substance abuse disorders, trauma therapy (TF-CBT), sexual therapy, and independent living skills). Multiple programming components can be offered to youth at the same time. Various community services work and prosocial community-based activities are also offered. The program continues to partner with community organizations to present opportunities for educational, occupational, and life skill development. During their stay, many youth recoup school credits through regular schooling or work towards and attain GEDs through enrolling in GED preparatory classes.


Great attention is paid to ensuring youth are provided with the skillset to become productive members of society. The facility offers a transitional living skill curriculum to youth in the secure residential program that focuses on skills such as self-care, budgeting, nutrition, seeking employment, preparing for job interviews, searching for housing, vehicle maintenance, applying for college, and many other skills. Additionally, youth are allowed to participate in an employability program that provides youth with job-skill development through cleaning the Clay County Family Service Center. Staff teach youth the importance of following task guidelines, paying attention to detail, and taking pride in their work. Youth are compensated with credit towards community service hours and with funds that can be taken with them upon their release.

Over the past year, the facility has partnered with Minnesota State Community and Technical College (MSCTC) and Lakes Country Service cooperative to provide resources and services to the youth that we serve. Through this collaboration, we have provided our youth with career and personality assessments to aid them in determining possible career paths. Representatives from MSCTC have facilitated groups with our youth to explain what their results mean and how they can work towards their educational and occupational aspirations. Additionally, they have provided youth with college tours and have done a great job providing clarification to them on how to apply for and be successful in college. We look forward to watching this partnership continue to expand and to see the potential for what services can be offered to our youth continue to grow.

The facility is excited to announce that an independent living skills program will also open in February 2020. The Community Living Independent Programming and Skills (CLIPS) program will be available for males and will provide programming designed to integrate youth into the community and assist them in developing independent living skills. Youth may be authorized to attend school in the community and attain employment. The program will be located in a new unit in the facility and will serve as an appropriate option for youth with minimal options for housing or as a stepdown program from the secure residential program.
